



PARTICIPANT INFORMATION SHEET

The Beaver Camp staff is looking forward to serving you. To make your stay more pleasant, and to respect other guests and neighbors, please take note of the following items.

PREPARING FOR YOUR STAY:

1. Bring your own towels and bedding unless you are staying in motels, where linens are provided (for the queen bed only – not the bunks).
2. Pets are not allowed at camp.
3. Alcoholic beverages, illegal drugs, fireworks, and firearms or any other type of weapon are prohibited.
4. If you have any special needs as a result of a disability or medical condition, please inform your group representative of this need.

PROCEDURES AT CAMP:

1. No smoking is allowed in any buildings.
2. Bathing suits are to be worn in the beach area only. Shoes must be worn at all times with the exception of the beach area.
3. Dress should be modest and appropriate for the activity engaged in.
4. Quiet must be observed after 11 p.m. in respect to other guests and other camps situated around Beaver Lake. Noise travels extremely well on the lake. When using sound equipment please keep the volume low enough that it cannot be heard outside the room.
5. Persons not staying at camp overnight must depart the premises by 11:00 p.m.
6. There are no public laundry facilities available. Please see the host/hostess for any emergency laundry needs.
7. Telephone is available for guest use in the Lodge office lobby. No international calls allowed.
8. Messages of a non-emergency nature will be posted on the message board in the dining room. Someone can usually be reached at phone # (315) 376-2640. Incoming calls after 5:00 p.m. will get an answering machine, which has an emergency contact number indicated.
9. We ask your cooperation in preserving the natural environment by observing the following:
 - Do not pick wild flowers or other plants.
 - Do not litter, either on the campgrounds or in the wooded areas. Place all trash in the barrels provided.
 - We recycle: please place all cans and bottles for return deposit in the containers provided. Plastic, glass, and metal should be brought to the recycle barrels behind Alder.
 - Campfires are allowed in designated areas only. Please get permission before starting any fires.
 - No Personal Watercraft (Jet Skis) are allowed on Beaver Lake
If you bring a motorboat; it (and trailer) MUST be washed and inspected (by our staff) prior to putting in to Beaver Lake
10. Off road motorized vehicles must be limited to entering and exiting the campground. They are not to be driven across Buck Point Road or on the camp lawns.
11. Dining room procedures:
 - Meals are served buffet style. Parents, please go through the buffet line with your children.
 - Please be prompt to meals so that we may serve you the tastiest food possible.
 - A bell is rung when the meal is ready to be served.
 - Please do not enter the dining room until the bell has rung, weather permitting (during cold or wet weather, find a seat at a table first, then you will be released by tables to go through the buffet line).
 - Go through the buffet line as you enter the dining room, then find your table
 - Please do not take more food than you know you will eat; you may help yourself to seconds after everyone has gone through once.

- When finished, bring all eating utensils to the dish return window, separate your silver ware, and pass everything else to the dishwasher person.

12. Waterfront Guidelines:

- Swimming: swim only when lifeguard is on duty or if you are using the pavilion beach wading area and you have signed the swimming release form and reviewed the swimming guidelines.
- Boating:
 - If no lifeguard is on duty, any boating activity by persons under 18 must be supervised by parent(s).
 - Do not use any boats that the person is not trained in its safe and proper use.
 - No boating after dark or boating in the swim area.
 - Please do not sail if inexperienced.
 - If no lifeguard is on duty the boat sign out sheet/waiver must be signed
 - Lifejackets must be worn in all watercraft at all times by ALL (adults and children).
 - Do not drag boats on the beach, carry them.
 - No horseplay or intentional tipping of boats allowed.
 - When finished, put boats, lifejackets, paddles, sails, etc. back as they were found.

DEPARTURE:

1. Camp buildings and grounds are to be left neat and orderly at the time of departure. Any breakage or damage to buildings and equipment will be paid for by the group or individual responsible.
2. You must be out of your rooms by 11 a.m. unless stated otherwise.
3. Check thoroughly to assure that you have not left any personal belongings. Beaver Camp is not responsible for items left. Should you leave items, please make your own arrangements to obtain them.
5. Take with you memories of your stay that will enrich your life. Please fill out an evaluation form and leave it in the office.

DIRECTIONS TO CAMP:

From Points North

Via RT 12. Stay on RT 12 South into Lowville, turning right at the 1st light, then turn left at the next light onto River St. (across from Stewarts) then follow "**On the Number 4 Road.**"

Via RT 26. Stay on RT 26 South into Lowville to the 4th light, then turn left onto River St. (across from Stewarts) then follow "**On the Number 4 Road.**"

Via Rt 812. Follow Rt 812 south into Croghan, turn left onto Convent St. (across from Nice and Easy), which becomes Kirchnerville Rd. Follow and turn right onto Erie Canal Rd., after about 6 miles turn left at the stop sign onto the Number Four Rd. Beaver Camp is 10 miles from this intersection.

From Points West

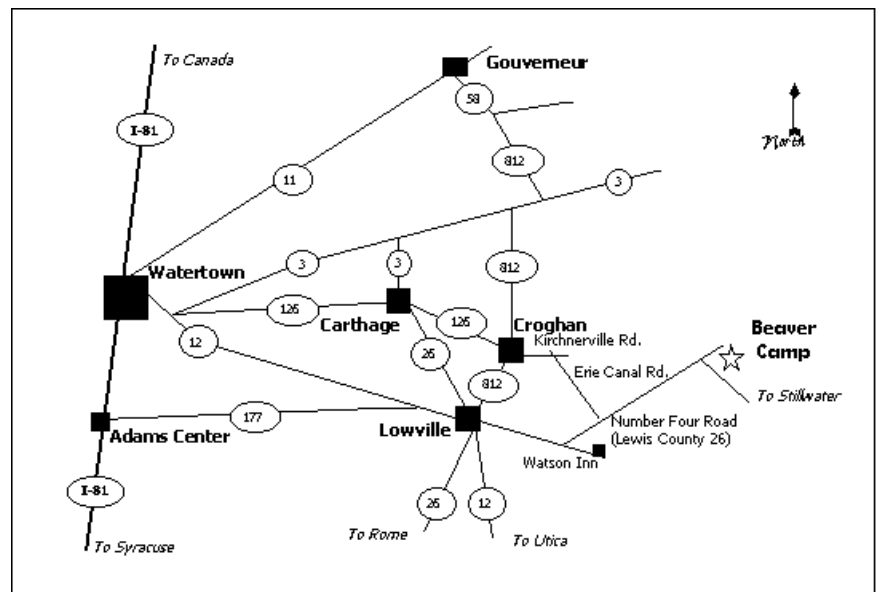
Via Rt 177. Stay on Rt. 177 East, merging onto Rt. 12 South. Follow Rt. 12 South into Lowville to the 2nd light, then turn left onto River St. (across from Stewarts) then follow "**On the Number 4 Road.**"

From Points South

Via RT 12 or 26. Follow North to the 2nd light, then turn right onto River St. (across from Stewarts) then follow "**On the Number 4 Road.**"

On the Number Four Road

Follow River Street to the 4-way stop. Go straight. You are now on the Number Four Road (County Route 26). Be sure to turn left approximately 3.6 miles outside Lowville (just past Millers Meat Market, across from Guignard's Nursery). It is approximately 15 miles from this intersection to Beaver Camp.
